## Resumption of International Ferry Passenger Transport

## Between Japan and China

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, passenger transport by international ferry between Japan and China has been suspended since January 28, 2020, and also due to significant delays in the renovation of the passenger terminal building on the Shanghai side, passenger transport has remained suspended to this day. However, the renovation works have finally been completed, and passenger transport between Japan and China will resume on Saturday, June 28, departing from Shanghai and arriving in Osaka on Monday, June 30.

As before, the ship alternates Osaka and Kobe, arriving every Monday morning, disembarking passengers, and conducting immigration procedures. The following Tuesday morning, it conducts departure procedures for departing passengers and embarkation.

The only passenger ship in operation is "Jian-Zhen-Hao", which entered service last year, and our other ship, "Xin-Jian-Zhen" will be used for cargo transport only. This marks the resumption of passenger services for the first time in five and a half years, and we look forward to welcoming you aboard our newly built ship with its enhanced facilities.

Please note that the first four voyages after the resumption of passenger transport will be "confirmation voyages," and general passengers will be able to board from the V.0113 departing from Shanghai on Saturday, July 12.
